Nano drew strength from her prayerful devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In Jesus, Nano experienced the human face and heart of God's compassion, and sought to share this love and compassion with others. She named her religious community The Sisters of Charitable Instruction of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on its establishment in 1775. The congregation's name was later changed to the Sisters of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
